This is a hands on experience designed for pump installers, well drillers, and engineers. Recognize when the problem is in the well or present in the aquifer through “timed testing”. This includes coliform bacteria, odors (rotten egg/musty/oily), slime/iron bacteria, discoloration, etc. Your customers will call you doctor.
